PCC History 1988-89

The Annual Meeting and Installation of Officers was held at St Davids Inn on Monday November 7th with 84 members and guests present. Dinner was preceded with a reception at 6:30 PM. Line officers were installed by State President Marshall E Lignian II and President Hyberg was installed by Past President General Warren G Hayes, Jr. President Hyberg gave a short acceptance speech after which awards were given to several members including Jim Anders, Herb Zearfoss, and Herb Armstrong.

38 members attended the Dec 5th noon luncheon meeting at the Engineers Club, called to order by President Hyberg.. A Heroism Medal and Certificate were presented by President Hyberg to John McKelvey, Jr., age 21 who saved the lives of 5 members of a family as their boat overturned while launching It in the Delaware River May 15th. Also, of interest, Flag Chair Herb Armstrong and Harold Wood presented the SAR Certificate for Exemplary Patriotism to C Blair Ives, Jr, president of the Ives Company of King of Prussia for the proper and prominent display of the American Flag.
