PCC History 1990-91

The Annual Meeting and Installation of Officers for 1990-1991 was held again at the Bala Golf Club on Wednesday evening, November 7, 1990. Entertainment for the Reception was furnished by The University Glee Club. The Installation ceremony was led by Edward E Gray, Vice President General, Mid Atlantic District, NSSAR. The following officers were elected, President-Leon Solis-Cohen, Esq, 1st VP- LtC Herbert T Armstrong, 2nd VP-Rev David Hackensmith, Secretary- William G Dorwart, Treasurer- Richard R DiStefano. Rev James M Murray, President PASSAR was the speaker. President Solis-Cohen gave a short acceptance talk. Past President Anders presented many medals and awards to numerous compatriots for outstanding service. Then VP General Gray awarded the past president ribbon to Past President Anders. The first meeting with the new officers took place at the Racquet Club on December 3,1990. Budget for 1991 was \$8375.

The first meeting of the new year was January 7, 1991 at the new location, Mile Post Inn in Stratford, PA. Coincident with the new location is the celebration of the 90th anniversary of the Philadelphia Continental Chapter. The State Society approved the establishment of the Philadelphia Chapter on March 21, 1901. Wayne Presbyterian Church has provided space for our flags and files. The Washington Birthday Celebration was held Saturday February 23, 1991 with flag raising and wreath setting at Independence Hall. The group then moved to Washington Square, Tomb of the Unknown Rev War Soldier, for the wreath setting. The reception, luncheon and program was at The Bistro, 510 Walnut St. The February 4th Luncheon Meeting at the Mile Post Inn set a modern record with 60 members and guests present. The sign-up sheet shows the signatures of these compatriots and is in excellent condition. Treasurer Richard DiStefano resigned March 15, 1991replaced by Jim Musslewhite

The Annual Church Service was held April 14th at St Mark's Church, Frankford. 2nd VP Rev David Hockensmith is the Rector of this church. The presentation of colors preceded the Service of Morning Prayer by the Preacher Rev James M Murrey, President PASSAR. A social time followed in the Church Hall. The Luncheon Meeting on May 6, 1991 was at the Mile Post Inn. Significant here is that the speaker was the well known City Councilman Thatcher Longstreth. He had already been awarded the Gold and Bronze Medals for past speaking engagements so President Solis-Cohen presented him with a certificate. Also, the first Lottery Drawing known was at this meeting won by Frank Brown son of well known Henry Brown. The 98th Annual Meeting of the Pennsylvania Society was on May 3 &4, 1991 at the Great Valley Hilton Hotel. May 27th saw the PCC Color Guard in review at the Radnor Memorial Day Parade. Significant here is that the great grandson of Bill DeWart, 3 year old Andrew Murdock, led the PCC Color Guard in his battery operated Jeep over the 1.6 mile route.

The 22nd annual Luncheon celebrating the signing of the Constitution of the United States was held at Stouffer Valley Forge Hotel on September 21st. Honorable Curt Weldon, US Congressman from Pennsylvania, was the guest speaker. Sunday Sept 8th, saw Charlestown Township celebrate the restoration of the Old Charlestown Cemetery on Charlestown Road. Last spring several volunteer groups cleared out a generation of underbrush. Boy Scouts of Troop 524, Trooper, PA did much of the work. The October 7th Luncheon Meeting was named The Rev John Fleck Meeting, celebrating his 100th birthday this week. Rev Fleck is an active athletic gold medalist swimmer. He brought home six gold medals from various events the summer of 1991.

The Annual Dinner Meeting and Installation of Officers for 1991-1992 was held at the Bala Golf Club November 6th 1991. Secretary Dorwart read the slate of proposed officers for the coming year-President LTC Herbert T Armstrong, 1st VP Rev David Hockensmith, 2nd VP David Cole, Secretary William Dorwart, Treasurer James Musslewhite. After being duly approved they were installed by Past President General Warren G Hayes, Jr. Compatriot Hayes then installed Col Armstrong as President, bestowing on him the ribbon of office and gavel of authority.
